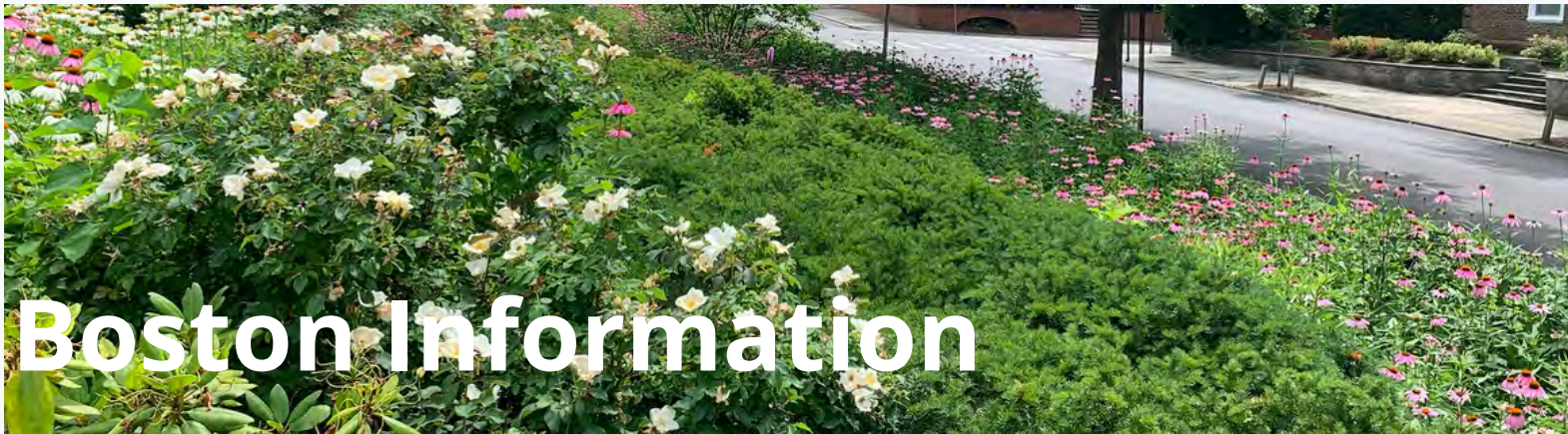

## Land History of the Area of Boston Where We are Meeting

The 2025 ASOR Annual Meeting takes place on land that has been the home of the Massachusett and other Native peoples of North America for 13,000 years. ## Boston Highlights:

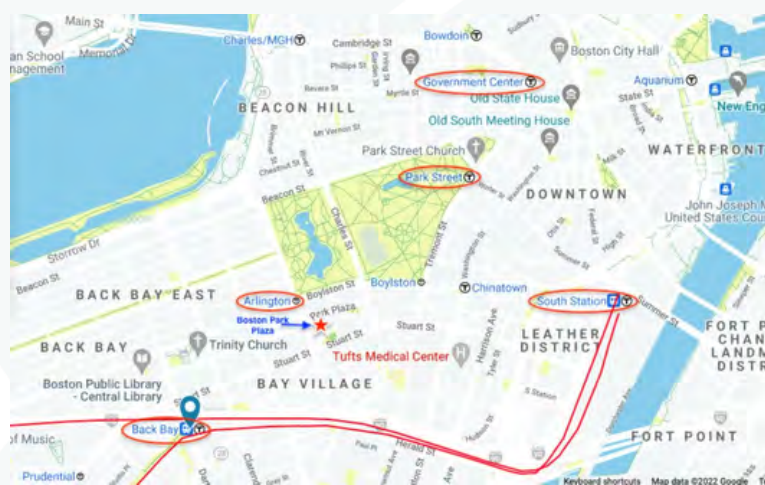

## Getting Around:

Public Transportation is an easy and cheap option for getting around Boston.

The **MBTA**, or simply the “T”, is Boston’s inclusive transportation system. Use the MBTA [Trip Planner](#), which lets you plan your T ride from start to finish. A map of the T subways can be found [here](#).

The closest T stops to the Boston Park Plaza are the Arlington Street (Green Line) and Back Bay (Orange Line) Stations. From the airport you can take the blue line to Government Center and switch to the Green Line to Arlington T Station, which is approximately 500 feet from the hotel entrance. Other options include the Logan Express (LEX) from the airport to Back Bay Station (about a half mile from the hotel) or the free Silver Line bus to South Station (approximately .8 miles from the hotel).

## Encyclopædia Iranica

The Encyclopædia Iranica is dedicated to the study of Iranian civilization in the Middle East, the Caucasus, Central Asia, and the Indian Subcontinent. The academic reference work will eventually cover all aspects of Iranian history and culture, as well as all Iranian languages and literatures, facilitating the entire range of Iranian studies research from archeology to political sciences.

Until recently, the project was carried out at Columbia University. In March 2025, the Encyclopædia Iranica relocated to University of California Irvine and is now housed at the Samuel Jordan Center for Persian Studies.
